A block of rooms is available for reunion attendees at the **Hilton Grand Wayne** (260-420-1100), Fort Wayne, IN. The rate is \$119.00/per night, including breakfast for up to two people per room. This special rate also applies for up to two nights prior to the reunion and two nights after the reunion. Fort Wayne is easily accessible by driving or flying. It is 18 miles from the Ohio border, 50 miles from the Michigan border, and 122 miles from Indianapolis. Fort Wayne International Airport is served by the following airlines: Allegiant, American, Delta, and United.

Fort Wayne is home to 15 museums and art galleries, the Allen County Public Library, a botanical garden, and the gravesite of John "Johnny Appleseed" Chapman, among other attractions. Three families named Sowle were living in nearby Steuben County by the 1840 census.

Introduction

Soule Kindred in America, a non-profit member organization, was founded in 1967 by two descendants of Pilgrim George Soule, Col. John Edward Soule and George Standish Soule. Membership is open to anyone although most are descendants of George Soule. There are currently 378 members, the majority of which are located in the United States. Soule Kindred programs and activities include:

- Soule Kindred Newsletter, published three times per year, that documents the history and milestones of the Soule family in America
- Family Tree Database and assistance for members seeking to identify their ancestors and document their genealogy
- Reunions, hosted in different locales, where cousins can meet, mingle and learn about their shared history
- Research on Soule family genealogy, including US and European roots
- Participation in the Mayflower Society DNA project
- College scholarships awarded to Soule descendants
- Communication through traditional and non-traditional outlets including through the newsletter, our website *soulekindred.org*, Facebook and other social media outlets

Over the past few years, the Board of Soule Kindred in America (SKA) has been working to strengthen and grow the organization to better serve its members-descendants of the Pilgrim George Soule. As part of this effort, in 2012 the Soule Kindred Board revised its by-laws, conducted several member surveys on topics such as the newsletter, the scholarship program, and member priorities for services. They developed concrete short and long-term goals, and monitored progress towards the goals. In 2013 at the Meridian, MS, reunion, the Board began developing a three-year strategic plan. They hired a strategic planning consultant, Dr. Judith Miller, and spent considerable time developing the vision, the mission and key major goals. The resulting vision, mission and goals are found below. As a next step over a period of approximately a year, the Board worked on the details for accomplishing the goals, such as the objectives, activities, person responsible, timelines and benchmarks, and evaluation method(s). Board members accomplished this with input from SKA members, including committee members where applicable. Communication vehicles included conference calls, email discussion, and face to face meetings. The full strategic plan was adopted by the Board on November 1, 2014 and can be found below.

The Board recognizes that the strategic plan is a living document that will change over time as new opportunities and circumstances occur. Therefore, the plan will be revisited each year in January and revised as needed.

Vision

Our vision is for the Soule Kindred organization to be the premier resource for information and genealogy about George Soule and his descendants. We will expand and support a vibrant, active family community.

Soule Kindred in America, Inc., is a non-profit organization dedicated to furthering the knowledge, understanding and appreciation of Mayflower Pilgrim George Soule and his descendants.
