A native of Hanson, Massachusetts, she was born Aug. 18, 1914. Doris was preceded in death by her husband Mason Frederick Sturham in 1992. She is survived by her daughter Marjorie Jean Kane (also a SKA member); son Lane Haven Coulter (Veronica); 2 grandchildren; 6 great grandchildren and 2 great-great grandchildren. She was buried in Memory Gardens Cemetery, Concord, California. Doris was a member of SKA since 2009.


Did you know...


The Pilgrims began planting their first garden covering 26 acres on March 19, 1621.

The Mayflower was built as a cargo ship, not a passenger ship. Typically, the Mayflower's cargo was wine and dry goods, but on this trip the ship carried passengers: 102 of them, all side of the Atlantic.

The Separatists who founded the Plymouth Colony referred to themselves as "Saints," not "Pilgrims." The use of the word "Pilgrim" to describe this group did not become common until the colony's bicentennial.






Drop down menus create a cleaner look and provide ease of navigation on the site.

A new mobile-friendly version of the website is available for use on smartphones.

The biggest change to the website is in the way SKA accepts online membership payments or donations. You can now join or renew your membership or donate to one of SKA's funds using your personal credit card instead of relying solely on PayPal, although that option is still available.



which they were published instead of shown in a single long list. This makes it much easier to locate a particular issue or article.




Soule Kindred Reunions of the Past By Kathleen Kingman

As I was glancing over past issues of *Soule Kindred Newsletter*, in search of past reunions that would be of special interest, I came across the 1995 Reunion, which took place in Burlington, Vermont. This caught my eye because I had lived in the Burlington area around that time, 1998-2005. Our oldest three children were born there, and I have special memories of living in such a beautiful state, with so much interesting history. As I looked over the Schedule of Events, familiar images popped up in my mind, and I couldn't help but smile.

The SKA President at the time was a Vermonter you might know, Stanley E. Soule. Stanley obviously knew all the best places to go: Shelburne Museum, Shelburne Farms, Lake Champlain Chocolate Co., Fleming Museum, Vermont Teddy Bear Co., von Trapp Family Lodge in Stowe, Ben & Jerry's Ice Cream Factory in Waterbury and the Burlington Church Street Marketplace.

The Reunion was planned for the peak of fall foliage season, and Stanley emphasized in ALL CAPS LIKE THIS to "PLEASE RESERVE EARLY" for "Once the balance of our block of rooms are released on August 13th, it is doubtful that there will be any available rooms, anywhere within the area." Hopefully most Soules took Stanley's advice. I can clearly remember the "Leaf Peepers" descending en mass at that time of year!!!

Soules had been gathering together for family reunions long before Soule Kindred in America officially launched as an organization in 1967. In our second-ever issue of

the newsletter (Vol. 1, No. 2, April 1967, page 13), a lively report from a 1949 reunion is included, written by William E. Soule (1876-1953). "Cousin Bill" came from a branch of the family descending from George Nelson Soule and Sarah Elizabeth (Brewer) Soule. Here is an excerpt from Cousin Bill's account of the 1949 Reunion:

Our Fourth Reunion was held at East Bridgewater, Massachusetts, in the building and on the grounds of the A.R. Parker Co., on Saturday, September 10, 1949. This was the scene of our Third Reunion on August 15, 1936, our first and second being held in Yarmouth, Maine, in 1902 and 1916 respectively.

In all 117 members of our family attended. And what a distinct success it was! Perfect weather, a joyous meeting all around, many of whom we had not seen since the last Reunion. Others were welcomed who had annexed themselves to the Soule family through marriage while the "kids", (God bless them) were in abundance, shall I say in accordance with tradition? A panoramic group picture of the Soule clan was another highlight of the affair.

After luncheon the boys formed two scrub teams and played baseball. After the melee had ended, your inquiring reporter learned that the Hardscrabbles had won over the Pawtucket Tigers by a score of 29 to 21. It was a pitcher's duel all the way!

Then everybody went inside the hall and a general meeting was held with Henry M. Soule, Chairman of the Reunion Committee, presiding. There was some speaking; an outline of the plans for the Soule genealogy by William E. Soule and group singing, led by Rev. Jerome J. Hevey, Jr., at the piano and Larry Soule, Sr. performing on the mouth organ. [Loud applause.] Then followed a special rendition of popular airs by the original quintet of 1902, in bowler hats and moustaches, as shown in the picture on this page. Harmony? After 47 years it was not only remarkable but terrific.

Dinner at the restaurant, including one of Mr. Parker's lobster stews (par excellence), was enjoyed by many of the group, after which the members headed for home. It is the consensus of opinion of those who attended that it was the best Reunion that we ever have had.

A little over two decades later, in 1970, we can visualize what Reunion planners hoped would be "the largest and best event in the Soule history to date." (Vol. IV, No. 2, page 105). This reunion, like our upcoming 2017 reunion, took place in Plymouth, Massachusetts.

We urge all Soule Kindred to make definite plans NOW to attend the GRAND SOULE REUNION which will celebrate the 350th landing of the Pilgrims. Events for the reunion include tours, family presentations, parties, recreation events, picture-taking, and lots of food for hungry Soules.

I guess some things never change, do they? In addition to good food, the reunion goers in 1970 enjoyed seeing (and hearing) a canon being fired, attending the official opening of the 350th Exhibit Hall and the

350th Film Theatre at Memorial Hall at Plymouth waterfront. Soule cousins also enjoyed a parade, a costumed, dramatized re-enactment of a Pilgrim Sabbath meeting held in Old Fort Meeting House, Thanksgiving, 1623 and more!


The "beautiful new two million dollar resort inn" (otherwise known as the Holiday Inn, Plymouth) cost \$14 for 1 person or \$20 for 2 people, per night. Additional persons cost \$3 each, and children under 12 were free. The costs for the SKA Reunion were as follows: Registration fee: \$3 per family; Saturday Luncheon \$2.50/adult, \$1.10/child and the Saturday Banquet Continued on next page

\$6/adult, \$3/child.

A highlight of the Reunion was Colonel John's talk on "One Thousand Years of Soule Family History," which was described as "superb in wording, scope and illustration. By urgent request he repeated it Saturday afternoon," reported Shirley Soule Smith, Secretary, Soule Kindred, 1970-1971. (Excerpt from *Soule Newsletter*, Vol. IV, No. 4 October 1970, page 169.)

The 1978 Reunion brought Soules back to Massachusetts, to Duxbury, and to get family members fired up, the following cover of *Soule Newsletter* (Vol.XII, No. 2, April 1978) hit the stands:



In case your eyes are straining to read the fine print, the words just above the Lobster illustration entice readers to LOOK: THIS IS WHAT WE ARE HAVING FOR THE SEPTEMBER SOULE REUNION

Then, under the giant letters that shout out CLAMBAKE, families are encouraged to make their choice between Lobster – Steak – Chicken!!!!! And to: Start making your plans and prepare for the good times we share when we get together. Each year there is something different to see and do. Meet old friends and make some new acquaintances. Share in the fellowship of a group such as we have.

It may be hard to believe for some of you, especially those who may have attended the 1978 and/or 1970 Reunions, that it was 39 or 47 years ago!!! And here we are today, returning to Plymouth and Duxbury, as our Soule cousins have done many times before, to honor our forefathers and foremothers and celebrate 50

years of our official Soule Kindred in America organization! It won't be long now... and I for one, can't wait to see you there!

Transportation to Plymouth:

Members who are flying into Boston's Logan Airport and do not wish to rent a car at the airport and drive to Plymouth may take the Plymouth-Brockton Bus Line. These buses leave Logan Airport hourly and stop at exit 5, Route 3, at the Visitors Information Center in Plymouth.

Taxi service is available to take you from exit 5 to your hotel or you may call Mayflower Taxi at (508) 747-1702 for service. For train, check the Massachusetts Bay Transit Authority (MBTA) Kingston/Plymouth line, leaving regularly from South Station www.mbta.com/schedules_and_maps.

If you are flying into T.F. Green Airport, Providence, Rhode Island, you will need to rent a car at the airport or in the nearby surrounding area, as there is no bus service from Providence to Plymouth.
