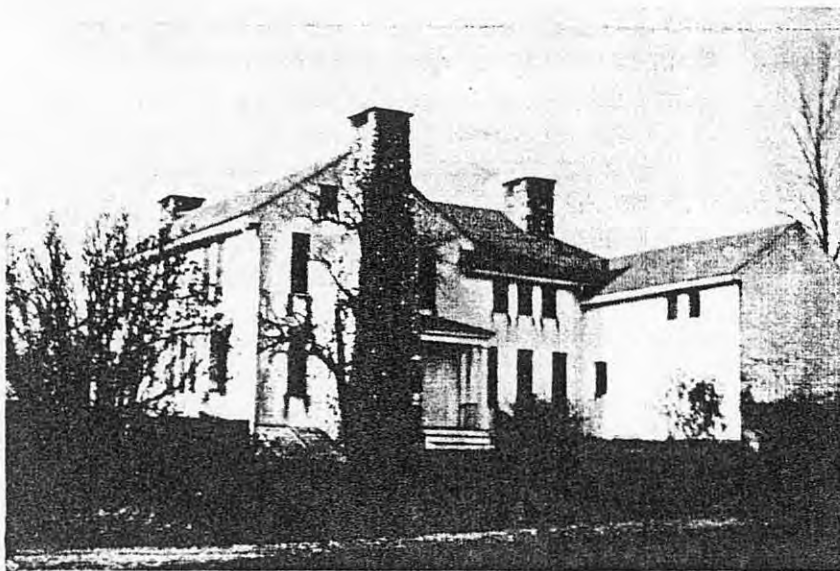

Dear Sir:

Some time ago I wrote to you regarding a picture I had of the Ebenezer⁶ Soule home in Hillsdale, N. Y. He was born May 14, 1750 in Dutchess County, N. Y. and married Mercy Foote. In answering my letter you expressed an interest in seeing this picture and more details concerning it. This Ebenezer Soule is your and my common ancestor, I being the sixth generation from him through his first daughter, Martha B. Soule who

married Enos Howard. I am enclosing a picture of the house for you to keep and also a page from one of my note books showing the additions and connected barn. The house is not an "old house" as houses go in New England but of interest to me and quite possibly to you if you do not already know of its existence. I went to see it in 1942 and was not impressed with the remodeling that had been done some twenty years earlier but the two chimneys are massive and rugged and the date, 1783 is in the north east one, possibly the time of construction.

According to my notes, Joseph Foote property joined the Soule property on the South and the ruins of the Foote house foundations are still there. Somehow I have a feeling that the Foote family were located there first, the Soule family moving to adjoining land in 1783, but I have no proof of this. Clarence Foote, a descendant of Joseph Foote and Mercy ? Foote, was a Teacher in Brainard, N. Y. and historian for the town of Duanesburg, N. Y. in 1936. He compiled "A

Memorial of the Town of Duanesburg and surrounding area including cemetery records of the town of Esperance" and I believe that was a part of Hillsdale.

The descendants of Enos Howard and Martha B. Soule, his wife, can be found in book form in several libraries, the Archives in Washington D. C., Buffalo library, Boston Historical Society, etc. My Aunt, Mrs. Sherman McNeil, He Clay Young and Clarence Foote worked together on the children of the above. were a hardy crew having large families and living to produce more large families. The men were circuit riders, ministers or teachers and these interests are in my branch today.

Martha B. Soules Howard is buried in the Howard cemetery on the original land they cleared and this land is still owned by the descendants of Enos Howard. In the picture of her tombstone I see her name is spelled SOULS - there seems to be a good deal of variety in spelling of Marthas brothers and sisters and among her children.

I hope this may be of interest to you. I hope as time passes more material will come to light and made available for people to use, such as the five generation project which I think is invaluable as well as a monumental undertaking.

For those interested in D. A. R. membership, the descendants of Ebenezer Soule and Mercy Foote can claim him and her father Joseph Foote as soldiers who fought in the War and the descendants of Martha B.⁷ Soule and Enos Howard can claim the above as well as Enos Howard. Through the grandmother of Orson W.¹⁰ Barker, all of the descendants of James Moses Barker and Margaret Pattison can claim William Pattison of Colrairie, Mass. as well as the three mentioned above.

Much of the data concerning the Enos Howard family and descendants may be found in the Niagara Frontier Gen. Magazine, Vol. 2, page 31.

SOULE FAMILY BIBLES § Continuing our practice started with Vol. V, No. 3 of publishing family bible records in the Soule Newsletter we are happy to present the following. Kindred wishing to share THEIR records should follow the instructions given on pages 113-115 of Vol. V when typing up the information.

Bible of PETER JACOB⁸ SOULE (1831-1904)

This Bible is in the possession of George Standish Soule and is presently in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma. Another Bible of Peter Jacob⁸ Soule is on page 121 of Vol. V Soule Kindred Newsletter. The below Bible evidently belonged to Peter Jacob's wife. It is a most interesting book, being arranged by subject rather than by books of the Bible. It carries the title "The Complete Analysis of the HOLY BIBLE: or How to Comprehend Holy Writ from its Own Interpretation, containing the whole of the Old and New Testaments, Collected and Systematically Arranged in Thirty Books;..." by Rev. Nathaniel West, D.D., published in New York: A. J. Johnson, Publisher, 276 & 278 Mulberry Street, 1869.

The inscription inside the cover reads:

"This Book is for J I Soule At my Death - his mother EA Soule"

"This Book is Presented To Frank and Lottie Soule from mother Bogue"

"Presented to George Standish Soule by his grandmother, Mrs. F. C. (Lott) Soule."

From dropout to school director

Community post another challenge for Gary Soule

Gary Soule, once a high school dropout, is Minneapolis's first full-time community school director.

Several years and perhaps a dozen jobs ago, Gary Soule sat watching his computer's flashing lights, and wondered how a man who loved people ever took a job babysitting a machine.

He was a high school dropout determined to change his lot and he did — he earned two college degrees and in January he became the first full-time community school director in Minneapolis.

Giving up the computer job wasn't easy — Soule (as in pool) had a family and the \$280 he earned

each month represented a security they had begun to appreciate.

Nevertheless, he was determined and, besides, he'd struggled with adversity before.

His parents were divorced when he was 4, and a few years later his mother moved the family from Cannon Falls, Minn., to the hill country of the Missouri Ozarks to live with an uncle and an aunt.

"I was 10 and I can remember eating oatmeal for Sunday meals," said Soule, "and we had it for

Thanksgiving dinner once, too."

His mother gave him responsibility and he thrived on it. When he was a first-grader he dressed himself and found his own way to school.

At 11 he often worked eight-hour days in a saw-mill, sometimes playing hooky from school if the family needed the money or when the urge seized him.

When he was 13 his uncle and aunt were divorced, and the family moved to Minneapolis. Soule began

making decisions for the family and he worked as a guide in a riding school.

He was a "B" student in high school, but it bored him and he quit in his senior year to join the Navy. He was the only one of his mother's four children to quit school.

"I guess high school didn't offer me much," said Soule, "and I thought that the Navy couldn't get along without me."

Brash and full of youthful confidence, he met a girl working in an ice cream parlor and when she asked

for his order, he replied, "A chocolate sundae and you." After some persuasion and a lot of ice cream, she became his wife. He was 17.

He was a baker in the Navy stationed at the Twin Cities Naval Air Station. To earn extra money he bought a panel truck and hauled wholesale plastics. The job went well so he bought another truck and hired a driver.

Most of the men in his family were laborers or truck drivers and he always expected to be one too.

After he was discharged he took an art course by correspondence, but it didn't work out. He worked as a bakery salesman, but quit that to work on computers. Like his other jobs, the last became less and less satisfying until finally he felt he had to move on.

"One night, we went to a sportsman's show and I started talking with a man who had a booth. I told him how much I always wanted to work on a dude ranch and I guess he saw something in me, because he wanted me as his assistant," said Soule.

It paid only \$500 for three months, but it meant working with young people on a South Dakota ranch. So despite some qualms, he left his wife and children in Minneapolis with her parents and took the job.

She didn't tell him until later, but while he was gone people were insisting he was a loser that she'd be better off without. She ignored them.

"I knew I was going somewhere," said Soule, "I just didn't know where."

He found his new job fas-

cinating, and after the three months were up, he moved his family to South Dakota. He was 21 and drove a school bus and worked part-time as a grocery stockboy alongside 13-year-olds.

He began to rue the day he quit high school and ruined, so he thought, his chances of ever going to college.

His family had barely unpacked when a friend convinced him that with or without a diploma, he could attend college somehow if he wanted to badly enough.

He did.

He told his wife he wanted to return to Minneapolis and attend the University of Minnesota. As he explained to her that she'd have to go back to work and that he didn't know what he'd study in school, he had a nagging feeling that she might find this to be the last straw.

To his relief and lasting gratitude, she said okay, and started packing.

He did well on qualifying examinations and was admitted in 1966 to study social work.

During his last quarter as an undergraduate, he started work on his master's degree. He had three children and worked 40 hours a week driving a truck and in a settlement house. Later he worked as a probation officer and as a marriage counselor.

After graduation he worked for the Community Health and Welfare Council and in 1969 he took a job with the Minneapolis Public School system.

Now at 32, and after working at so many different jobs that he has difficulty remembering them all, he has the kind of job

he wanted years ago—a job he might not have gotten had he not held all those other jobs.

He works from 9 a.m. to 11 p.m. to get the community involved in activities at South High School, 3131 19th Av. S. He has responsibility for evening and summer school programs.

He is, in the opinion of the director of community educational services, Paul Boranian, "a natural" in one of the "hottest" educational specialties in the country.

Soule's dedication to the concept springs from his belief that schools are not just for kindergarten through the 12th grade, but for the whole community.

He has made progress — 39,000 persons enrolled in a variety of programs used the school after regular school hours from Feb. 11 to May 25.

He has problems too—a lack of time to talk with area residents and difficulties in forming a council of residents to advise the community school.

And in taking different approaches sometimes he makes mistakes.

He enjoys the work, but now that he has a job that fills the need for human relationships, he finds his needs have changed.

"I've run the course of working only with people's minds. Now I enjoy working with the problems of organizations and systems," he said.

And yet Soule remains, generally speaking, the same person he was—a man who shuns parties because "people aren't themselves in those situations"—a man who gave his mother the high school diploma he earned recently.

He'll stay with the community school as long as it's challenging.

"I'm not the kind to stagnate in a position—I'm always looking around for new things and I hope I always will be," said Soule. "I've got to be productive—for myself and for others."

John Soule is back in Bethesda Naval Hospital, Ward 6D, Bethesda, M.D. He entered it the middle of February and hopes to get out the middle of March. The clipping left was received a few months ago from cousin Henchman Sylvester Soule of Freeport, Maine. Unfortunately it was not dated so we only know that Harold W. Small died in 1971.

Our family historian, Col. John Soule was amazed to learn that while Harold was a 10th Generation SOULE descendant, he was a 17th Generation BREWSTER descendant. In Col. Soule's own words, this is "Fantastic - unbelievable." (And as editor of the Soule Newsletter, I want to know WHO it was that described the Soule clan as "prolific" ??) JOSEPH¹ SOULE, of Fairfield, Vt., whose family and descendants form the subject of this article, was born about 1747,* and died at Fairfield 12 May 1820, "Ae. 73 yrs.," according to his gravestone in the Munro Soule Cemetery, in the western part of that town. He married, probably at New Fairfield, Conn., about 1767, EUNICE HUNGERFORD, born, probably in Connecticut, about 1751, died at Fairfield 19 Aug. 1839, "Ae. 88 yrs." (gravestone), daughter of Samuel and Mary (Graves).†

With his wife Eunice and their eight children, Joseph Soule came to Fairfield in 1791, thus becoming one of the early settlers of that town and establishing there one of the oldest and most honored families in the county. He was one of the men of Fairfield who followed Rev. Benjamin Wooster to the defense of Plattsburg, N. Y., in 1814.

ADDENDUM

SUPPOSED PARENTAGE AND ANCESTRY OF JOSEPH SOULE OF FAIRFIELD, VT.

JOSEPH SOULE, of Fairfield, Vt. (*vide supra*, page 85, 1), died 12 May 1820, "Ae 73 yrs.," according to the inscription on his gravestone. He was born, therefore, about 1747, and it is supposed that he was identical with Joseph⁶ Soule, son of Timothy⁴ and Elizabeth (Allen) of Dartmouth, Mass., and later of what is now Dover, Dutchess Co., N. Y., who is mentioned in the will of Mary (Gifford) Soule, the widowed mother of Timothy, dated 7 Jan. 1772, as the son of her deceased son Timothy. If this identification is correct, then Joseph Soule of Fairfield was fourth in descent from George¹ Soule of Duxbury in the Plymouth Colony, who came to New England in the *Mayflower* in 1620, and his wife Mary (Becket), through George² of Dartmouth and his wife Deborah, Nathan³ of Dartmouth and his wife Mercy or Mary (Gifford), and Timothy⁴ of what is now Dover, Dutchess Co., N. Y., and his wife Elizabeth (Allen).

Nathan³ Soule, son of George² and Deborah, married at Dartmouth, 12 June 1704, Mercy or Mary Gifford.* He died 10 Sept. 1736. In his will, dated 15 Nov. 1735 and proved 19 Oct. 1736, he mentions five children. His widow Mary, in her will dated 7 Jan. 1772 and proved 27 Jan. 1772, mentions six children and numerous grandchildren, including her grandson Joseph, son of Timothy, deceased. The children of Nathan Soule, recorded at Dartmouth, were: 1. Content, born 29 May 1705. 2. John (called eldest son in his father's will), born 20 Nov. 1707. 3. George, b. 15 Aug. 1709; married Avis ———; settled in Dutchess Co., N. Y.† 4. Cornelius, born 26 Jan. 1711 or 1712. 5. Timothy (called youngest son in his father's will),

Timothy⁴ Soule, son of Nathan³ and Mercy or Mary (Gifford), born 10 Apr. 1714, died before 7 Jan. 1772, when his mother, in her will, mentions him as deceased. He married at Dartmouth, 6 — 1736, 7, Elizabeth Allen, perhaps daughter of Joseph and Rachel, and, if so, born at Dartmouth in the "first week of" Mar. 1710. He moved to what is now Dover, Dutchess Co., N. Y., where he was a justice of the peace, as is proved by records signed by him. The only child of Timothy Soule of whom record has been found is Joseph,⁵ mentioned 7 Jan. 1772 in the will of his grandmother, Mary Soule. This Joseph is supposed to be identical with the Joseph Soule of Fairfield, Vt., with whom the foregoing genealogy begins, and who, according to family tradition and Hemenway's "Vermont Historical Gazetteer," vol. 2, p. 192, came to Fairfield from Dover, N. Y. It should not be overlooked that the eldest son of Joseph Soule of Fairfield was named Timothy.

Philip Soule of South Freeport, Maine, who is a recipient of your SOULE Newsletter, loaned them to me to look over. He and his brothers, Arthur and Charles are descendants from the same ancestor as I, Barnabas⁴ Soule. He has urged me to write to you. Maybe I can be of some help on some information to the Soule family of Freeport, Pownal and Yarmouth, North Yarmouth, etc.

All the Soules of Yarmouth, Freeport and Pownal are from two ancestors, Barnabas and Jedidiah Soul. That is the way Barnabas, Jedidiah and Capt. Cornelius Soul's name is spelled on two grave-stones, the (e) is left off.

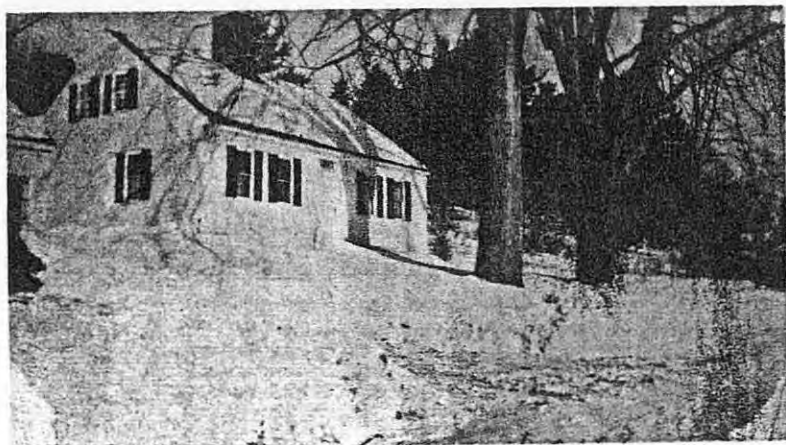
The original Barnabas Soul homestead is in the town of Freeport, east of the Cousin's River. Freeport was set off from North Yarmouth in 1789. Built in 1747 by Barnabas Soul. There was and is an original cellar hole built in 1726 just east of Cousin's River and looking west, John Cousin's cellar nearby, 1636 - 1643, first settler of Yarmouth, now Freeport.

This Barnabas Soul place out dates the one you had a picture of in your Newsletter* by about 60 years at least. The one on the north road in Yarmouth, Maine. No doubt the builders of this one in Yarmouth were descendants of Jedidiah Soul.

Capt. Cornelius Soule was another brother. The three of them came to North Yarmouth township about 1726 and settled. Cornelius Soule married a widow (Scales) whose husband was killed by the Indians about 1730. Cornelius Soul had no issue, no children, but he adopted a son of Mrs. Scales.

Barnabas and Jedidiah had large families. I have an idea Barnabas had the most descendants. Jedidiah at one time lived in Long Island in Casco Bay. It belongs to the city of Portland today. He lived there

quite a few years before he finally settled in North Yarmouth in the part that is now Freeport. Have never been there to find his gravestone. He may be buried on Long Island, Casco. Some day I will take my out-board and check on it in Burr Cemetery as Freeport has there an old slate stone which states that Hannah Soul was the wife of Jedidiah Soul, but this Jedidiah Soul is either a son or grandson of the original Jedidiah Soul.

Barnabas Soul is buried on the old Mallet Cemetery at Freeport. His stone states that he died in 1780 in his 80th year.

Now I'm coming to the main reason for writing this letter, Capt. Cornelius Soul's gravestone (the spelling on these stones are Soul. They are located in the old pioneer's cemetery on Gilman Street in Yarmouth, Maine) under the ledge where the first parish (Congo. stood) Church stood. No doubt the burying ground was the old cemetery of members of this church. In the Soule Kindred Newsletter, Vol. I, No. 3, July 1967, page 30, you state or someone states that Cornelius Soul was born 1712 and died 1782. It must be in error because his gravestone reads as quote with the picture. So you see he didn't live to 1782. He was quite a fellow though for his 52 years. He was a Capt. at Louisburg and he was a special courier to Gov. Shirley of the Commonwealth of Mass., to the eastward, riding horseback, delivering dispatches to the various forts east of Falmouth. He was the first representative to the General Court of Mass. at Boston from N. Yarmouth.

Maine was set off from Mass. in 1820, papers signed at Jamison Tavern, Freeport, Maine. Thought I would call your attention to this fact before the Soule Genealogy went to press. Good luck to Col. John Soule. He deserves a lot of credit.

The old Homestead on Pownal, Maine, was built around 1800 by Benjamin F. Soule, son of Capt. John⁵ Soule and brother Hon. Rufus⁶ Soule.

It was located on the east Branch of the Cousin's River on the Tuttle Road in East Pownal (dirt road) about one mile northwest of the Freeport town line. It is said that seven sea Capts. lived there at one time or another. Soule men all sea faring and Captains and ship builders.

Soule yards were one of the biggest in east coast 1830 - 1870. The Pownal homestead isn't in the family today.

I am, Henchman S. Soule and my wife is Margaret Hayward Soule, and we own a wood lot (Pownal) about one mile above the old homestead in Pownal and pay taxes in Pownal. It was part of that estate at one time.

The Pownal Soules all descended from Barnabas⁴ Soule line of Freeport. Capt. John⁵ Soule, son of Barnabas⁴ Soule was the father of Benjamin Soule. Rufus Soule the noted ship builder was also the son of Capt. John⁵ Soule. Capt. John Soule's gravestone is in the Mallet Cemetery in Freeport. It says to his memory. He may have drowned at sea. Hon. Rufus Soule's grave is in the Porter's Landing cemetery in Freeport. Barnabas⁴ Soul had five sons and several daughters, Barnabas⁵, Cornelius⁵ (named after Barnabas⁴ brother), Samuel⁵, Capt. John⁵ and Moses⁵ Soule.

Henchman, Enos and Clement were partners in one of the largest ship yards* in the State of Maine 1840 - 1860 located in Strout's Point, South Freeport, Maine. Their specialty was fast Clipper ships. One of these ships the "Tam-O-Shanter" out raced the fast "Shenandoah" from New York to San Fransico and beat her by four hours.

Soules married Soules. I am descended from Hon, Rufus Soule, the ship builder who is said to have built as many ships as the years he lived, eighty-seven.

There were Soules in the Revolutionary War for Independence from North Yarmouth. James Soul, a soldier in the Revolution has a flag on his grave in Burr Cemetery in Freeport, Maine each Memorial Day, as does Capt. John Soule in Mallet Cemetery.

James Soule was a son of Jaddiah⁴ Soule; Barnabas⁵ and William Soule were soldiers of the Revolution on pay roll for Capt. John Gray's Company in Col. Johnathan Mitchell's Regiment of Militia in the service of the United States in the expedition at Bagaduce (Penobscot), from the 7th of July to the 12th of September, inclusive, 1779.

John Soul, 1st Lieut. enlisted July 7th and discharged September 12, 1779, month pay was 8.2. amount pay 17 pounds, 6 shilling, 03 pence, page 293 Old Times North Yarmouth. Page 294 Barnabas Soul amount of pay 4. month, rank private. William Soule, private, 4.8 month.

There are two good histories of North Yarmouth, Maine. (Conliss's Old Times, North Yarmouth), 2 volumes, large and William Rowe's History of North Yarmouth and Yarmouth, Maine. Libraries in Yarmouth and Freemont, Maine, have them also. In Corliss's Old Times North Yarmouth, 2nd Vol. there are a dozen listings of Soule Genealogists compiled by Enos E. Soule and Dr. Charles E. Banks. William E. Soule was son of Enos C. Soule. William E. Soule was born at the old homestead in Freeport, Lambert Neck Road. William C. Soule is the father of William G. Soule who lives at Prince's Point, would be a reliable source of information and data, etc., on the Soule family. He is about 60 years of age and I know him well. William G. Soule is head of the Soule Paint and Glass of Portland, Maine, which branches at Lewiston, Pres. Isle and maybe Banjor (Wholesale firm) probably the largest firm of its kind in the State of Maine. I think he would give you a lot of information, etc. This is my personal view.

I am a carpenter by trade and belong to the Freeport Historical Society, Phippsbury Historical Society and am a self-styled historian. I am age 58 and I know a lot of history around these parts. Another source of information would be Mrs. Robert Campbell of Yarmouth, Maine. Her ancestors were from Barnabas Soule line. She is a leading Club lady and a member of Yarmouth Historical Society., etc.

Miss Louisa Talbert at Freeport Library could tell you a lot of information also. She is Assistant Librarian. I know of three different families who have the 2 volume set of Soule Genealogy (by Ridlon). Norman Kelly of West Point, Phippsbury, Maine., he spends summers there and winters in Florida has a set. Mrs. Robert Campbell has a set. Phillip and Charles Soule of South Freeport has the 2 volume set.

My Great Aunt Annie Soule, granddaughter of Hon. Rufus Soule whose husband was a Capt. in the first Calvary during the Civil War had a set and gave them to my sister Kathryn Soule but she sold them years ago. I have read and studied them quite a bit, years ago. The Freeport Library has the 2 volume set too, I believe.

I remember going to a Soule reunion picnic in 1916* when I was about seven years of age. They held it in Russell Grove on Casco Bay, at Broad Cove, Cumberland, Foreside, Maine. Just over the town line from Yarmouth. I kind of think William E. Soule was the leader of it. I am sending you some snapshots you may keep and I hope I may have been of some help to you with some Soule data.


Dear Cousins:
